Paul L. "Larry" Bales, age 86 of Mattoon, IL passed away at 12:20 AM, Monday, May 27, 2019 at Odd Fellow-Rebekah Home in Mattoon, IL.

A funeral service in his honor will be held at 2:00 PM, Thursday, May 30, 2019 at Mattoon First United Methodist Church, 1601 Charleston Avenue, Mattoon, IL 61938; Reverend Michael Smith will officiate and Reverend Robert Clark will assist. A committal service will follow in Roselawn Cemetery in Charleston, IL. The visitation is from noon until the time of service at the church. Mitchell-Jerdan Funeral Home is in charge of services.


