Mattoon, IL-Eula E. Walworth, age 94, of Mattoon, IL, formerly of Newton, IL, passed away at 3:34 a.m., Tuesday, June 24, 2014, at Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center.

The funeral service in her honor will begin at 1:00 p.m., Friday, June 27, 2014, at Mitchell-Jerdan Funeral Home, 1200 Wabash Avenue, Mattoon, IL 61938. Reverend John Hegelson will officiate.
