November 2, 1933 - June 11, 2014

MATTOON-Jane Elizabeth Tutt, 80, of Mattoon, IL, died at 7:02 a.m., Wednesday, June 11, 2014, surrounded by her family and friends.

Services honoring and celebrating her life will be held at 10:00 a.m., Monday, June 16, 2014, at Mitchell-Jerdan Funeral Home, 1200 Wabash Avenue, Mattoon, IL, with the Rev. Ken Hutchins officiating. Mrs. Tutt was born on November 2, 1933, in Sullivan, IN. She is the daughter of Jack Hall and Etta Dixon-Hall. She married Thomas Wright Tutt of Charleston, IL, on May 30, 1951. He passed away November 4, 2011. Even though being a mother and wife kept her busy, Jane graduated in the 1970"s from EIU with a degree in Business and Library Science. She also obtained her teaching license and substitute taught until she lost her eye sight. \r\n\r\nShe was an avid fan of traveling with her husband and family. She had traveled to South America, Australia, Europe, Hawaii, Canada, and most of the continental U.S. \r\n\r\nMrs. Tutt was a member of the First United Methodist Church, where she attended Agape Sunday School classes, was a member of Mary"s Circle and the United Methodist Women. She was a member of the Eastern Star, member and past president of the Coles County Home Extension, and member and past president of the DeMolay Mothers. \r\n\r\nIn its early years, Mrs. Tutt served as secretary and bookkeeper of Mattoon Excavating, then Service Equipment, a business founded and partially owned by Mr. Tutt.
