



## Stephen K. "Steve" Homann

April 2, 1943 - February 19, 2012

Mattoon, IL-Stephen 'Steve' K. Homann, age 68, of Mattoon, IL, passed away at his residence in Mattoon, IL on Sunday, February 19, 2012 at 7:40 A.M.

The funeral service in his honor will begin at 10:00 a.m., Thursday, February 23, 2012, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, in Dorans, IL. Reverend David Bessinger will officiate. Interment will be in Humboldt Township Cemetery, Humboldt, IL. Visitation will be held Wednesday evening from 4:00-8:00 p.m., at Mitchell-Jerdan Funeral Home, 1200 Wabash Avenue, Mattoon, IL 61938.

Born April 2, 1943, in Mattoon, IL, Steve was the son of Melvin C. and Freda K. (Knollenberg) Homann. He married Leanne Edwards on April 7, 1963. She survives.
